Healthy Parenting Spotlight: Parent Impact Story

A mother in the Healthy Parenting program talked about how she applied concepts she had learned in Parent Chats to her weekly routine. The mother spoke about one morning at breakfast before school where her 6-year-old daughter had spilled her cereal all over the table. She said that previously she would have yelled and screamed, which would have caused her daughter to cry. She would have angrily cleaned up the spill on her own, and the chaos might have caused her daughter to miss the school bus.

Instead, she paused and thought about what she had learned. She then spoke calmly with her daughter, told her it wasn't a big deal, and they cleaned it up together. Both the mother and her daughter stayed calm. Her daughter saw a great example of how to solve a problem, and they happily went on with their day without disruption. She was very proud of how she handled the situation.

Tech Tip: Zoom Mic Shortcuts

Did you know that you can mute and unmute your Zoom microphone without having to scramble for your mouse? We've all been there. Here are a few shortcuts that allow you to quickly adjust your audio settings:

- <u>Keyboard Shortcuts</u>: Pressing down these keys on your keyboard while attending a Zoom meeting is one efficient way to turn your mic on and off:
 - <u>Windows:</u> Alt + A
 - <u>Mac:</u> Command + Shift + A
 - ∘ <u>Linux:</u> Alt + A
- <u>Push to Talk</u>: Whenever your mic is set to mute, you can press down and hold your space bar to temporarily unmute yourself to speak. Once you let go of the spacebar, your mic will automatically return to mute.
- <u>Mute as Host:</u> If you are the host of a Zoom meeting, you can mute and unmute audio for all participants by pressing the Alt + M keys.
